

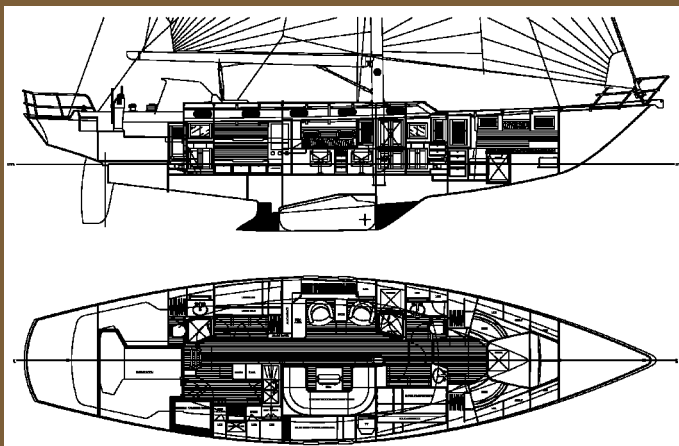

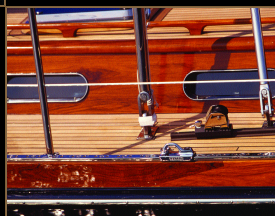

Her forward master cabin with a queen size berth on centerline allows easy access from both port and starboard. The main salon has a large area on the port side that acts as an office, nav station, and comfortable seating area. On the starboard side there is a U-shaped sitting area around the table with a pilot berth outboard. A large galley offers plenty of counter space—open and airy with plenty of light—adding a sense of room to the main salon area.
